**Executive Associate Dean, IUPUI Honors College** is responsible for the advancement of high ability, diverse undergraduate students in the IUPUI Honors College and strategically advances the impact of the Honors College on the IUPUI community and beyond. The executive associate dean ensures there is faculty leadership for academic affairs and operations within the College and is instrumental in shaping the programs, vision, and strategic plan of the Honors College. The EAD holds fiscal and budget oversight of the College and manages a staff of full and part-time employees to accomplish duties including policies and curriculum development, external relations with campus and community, recruitment and enrollment, branding, communications, and alumni relations.

**The Associate Dean for Academic Programs** leads the Office of Academic and Graduate Programs in the School of Liberal Arts. Responsibilities for this office involve all aspects of undergraduate and graduate curriculum, including course and program changes and development; online program development and collaborations; Honors program coordination; general education, major, School and IUPUI curriculum requirements; course scheduling and enrollments; course, program, and department assessment of curriculum and instruction; international curricular efforts, as well as graduate program and student oversight and support (e.g., block grants, internships, research assistantships). In addition, the ADAP provides school leadership on the development of new courses, minors, majors, certificates and programs.

**The Chair of the Department of Communication Studies** leads one of the largest departments in the School of Liberal Arts with more than 20 full-time and 30 part-time faculty, 200+ undergraduate majors, 25 MA and 10 PhD students. We are in the fourth year of our highly competitive PhD in Health Communication, leveraging the health and life sciences mission of the IUPUI campus. The department manages the largest General Education course on campus, COMM R110 Fundamentals of Speech Communication with approximately 4000 students per year, a competitive debate program, the Speaker’s Lab, a growing theatre program, a strong undergraduate communication club and honor society, a graduate communication club, strong service learning, civic and community relationships, and robust face-to-face and online course offerings.
